Golfing Star Farrell Makes Hall Of Fame

DUNEDIN, FLA. (UPI) — Johnny Farrell, who played on the first Ryder Cup team in 1927, Tuesday was named to the Professional Golfers Association's Hall of Fame, joining Lawson Little and Henry Picard among this year's selectees.

Farrell was chosen in a poll of living members of the PGA Hall of Fame under a format adopted last year. Little and Picard were picked last week in a nationwide poll of PGA members.

Little, Picard and Farrell will be formally inducted into the PGA Hall of Fame at the annual President's Dinner in Hollywood, Fla., Nov. 7. Their addition brings to 29 the number of players named to the hall since it was established in 1940.

Election is based on lifetime playing ability and only those

50 years of age or older and who are retired from active national competition are eligible.

Farrell was born in 1901 at White Plains, N.Y., and by 1923 was one of the top playing professionals, finishing in the money in every tournament he played in during that year and 1924.

In 1927, he scored victories in eight tournaments and tied for seventh in the U.S. Open. That earned him a spot on the Ryder Cup team with Al Watrous, Bill Mehlhorn, Leo Diegel, Johnny Golden, Al Espinosa, Gene Sarazen, Joe Turnesa and Captain Walter Hagen. They went on to defeat Britain, 9½ to 2½, in the first Ryder Cup matches between the two nations with Farrell winning both his singles matches and teaming with Turnesa to win a foursome match.
